Beech Leaf Disease Update



Beech Leaf Disease is an evergrowing problem affecting American Beech Trees in Ohio and surrounding areas. Beech Leaf Disease or BLD first appears as dark, interveinal bands of the leaves (as pictured above). This discoloration is best seen by holding the leaf up to the sky and looking through it. When identifying an American Beech Tree, they are often recognizable because of their smooth gray bark and alternating leaves. Their leaves have serrated margins which can be another tool used to identify this tree. The advanced symptoms can be seen as shrunken, curled leaves with a leathery texture and 2/3 of the leaf will have these bands. You may be wondering But what is causing this? The presence of nematodes or microscopic worms are the cause of the

dark banding of the leaves and subsequent damage to the Beech trees. Although it has not been confirmed in Seneca County, it is moving west across the state.

Market Reports

Overall April Reports: April Prices

Prices received by Ohio Farmers for the month of April were down in the following areas: Wheat, Milk, Eggs and Hogs.

Prices received by Ohio Farmers for the month of April were up in the following areas: Corn, Soybeans, Broilers, Cattle,.

Winter Wheat & Hay

As of June 1, expected bushels per acre is up 0.2 bushels from last month but down 2.1 bushels from last year.

Meat Animals

Commercial red meat production is down 4% from April of last year. Beef production was down 11% from 2022. Cattle slaughtered was down 10% from last year and the average live weight was down 19 pounds since 2022. Veal production was down 21% and calves slaughtered were down 22%. Pork production was down 4% and head slaughtered was down 3%. Lamb and mutton production was down 11% from April 2022, head slaughtered was down 6% and the average live weight was down 6 pounds.

Milk

April milk production was up 1.9% from 2022 and the production per cow was also increased. The average price of milk cows were up \$150 from April 2022. The average price of milk is down \$4.70 per cwt.

Chicken and Eggs

Total layers in Ohio was down 2% and egg production was down 3% from 2022.

As of June 25th 2023: Crop Progress

55% of the **Winter Wheat** *matured* which is up from the 49% 5-year average 1% of the **Winter Wheat** *harvested* which is down from the 3% 5-year average 78% of the **Oats** *headed* which is up from the 72% 5-year average 99% of the **Hay Alfalfa** 1st Cutting which is up from the 84% 5-year average 98% of the **Other Hay** 1st Cutting which is up from the 73% 5-year average 25% of the **Hay Alfalfa** 2nd Cutting which is up from the 17% 5-year average 11% of the **Other Hay** 2nd Cutting which is up from the 10% 5-year average Corn crop condition ranked 1% Very Poor, 3% Poor, 30% Fair, 61% Good and 5% Excellent. Soybean crop condition ranked 1% Very Poor, 4% Poor, 29% Fair, 61% Good and 5% Excellent. Winter Wheat crop condition ranked 5% Poor, 35% Fair, 53% Good and 7% Excellent. Oat crop condition ranked 2% Poor, 31% Fair, 66% Good and 1% Excellent. Pasture and Range crop condition ranked 1% Very Poor, 9% Poor, 36% Fair, 53% Good and 1% Excellent.

As of June 23rd, 2023: Chicken and Eggs

May egg production is up 4% from 2022. Egg-type chicks hatched up 2% and broiler-type chicks hatched down 1%. Table egg layers are down, total layers are down and eggs per 100 layers are down from 2022. Total egg production by type is down since 2022. 3% of total layers are being molted by June 1st and 8% has completed molt by June 1st. This is down since 2022.

As of June 21st, 2023: Milk Production

May milk production is up 0.8%. 252 per 1,000 head milk cows in Ohio, this is up from 2022. 1945 pounds of milk per cow in Ohio, this is up from 2022. 490 million pounds of milk produced in May 2023 in Ohio; this is up 1.7% from 2022.
