There will be paper skillathons to complete after the completion of judging for Food and Nutrition and Clothing and Textiles members. Skillathons will be graded after the judging day. Awards will be given for the following categories beginner- age 8-10, intermediate- age 11-13, and senior- age 14 and over. All ages are as of January 1st of the current year. The food and nutrition skillathon awards will be available in the club packets available at booth set-up. The sewing and textiles skillathon awards will be announced and given at the Style Review on Tuesday night of the fair.

Members will be able to pick up their premium directly following judging on the day they are judged. Members will need to visit the Jr. Fair Board office on their judging day to receive their premium money based on the grade that is noted on the pink judging sheet. Be sure to have your completed pink judging score sheet(s) with you.

For Judging Day

Members and/or family members may not attend if they or anyone living in their household is experiencing any of the following symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath, loss of sense of taste or smell, or has been directly exposed (confirmed or suspected) to COVID-19 if they are not fully vaccinated.

After ensuring that members and anyone within their household does not have any signs, symptoms or exposure to COVID-19:

We ask that members arrive no earlier than five minutes prior to your scheduled judging time for all projects other than clothing and textiles. For clothing and textiles projects, you may arrive no earlier than ten minutes prior to your scheduled judging time to allow time for you to change into your project for judging.

For Parents or Guardians

There will be no waiting area available in any of the buildings in which judging will be taking place to eliminate congregating. We ask that you please stay outside of the buildings or remain in your vehicles until your child has completed judging. If you decide to wait outside of the building, you must still maintain 6 ft. social distance from any other personnel. Rest assured that there will be plenty of welcoming and friendly adult and youth helping with judging that can assist your child in any way possible.

Guidelines for coming to face-to-face judging and other 4-H related events:

Face Masks

COVID-19 vaccinations are our best current protection against infection and a fatal outcome. Fully vaccinated individuals are not required to wear a face mask, however we strongly recommend eligible, but unvaccinated, individuals to continue to properly wear a face mask when social distancing cannot be maintained.

What we plan to do for face-to-face judging and other 4-H related events:

All entrance/exit door handles for the location and the doors handles of any accessible restrooms and any other high-touch surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected with an EPA-registered cleaner-disinfectant before and after judging.

All tables, chairs, and equipment will be sanitized before the event, after use by each individual, and after the conclusion of the event.

- Provide hand sanitizer that contains at least 70% alcohol at the registration tables or at a table near the entrance of the buildings.
- Tables, chairs, and waiting areas will all be at least 6' apart.

Virtual Judging

If your health is compromised or if you are uncomfortable with the face-to face judging, you may choose to do a virtual judging through Zoom.

There will be paper skillathons to complete after the completion of judging for Food and Nutrition and Clothing and Textiles members. Since you plan to join us virtually, we will have someone share the skillathon on the screen for you to look at and read and you will have to answer the questions verbally or through the chat box. No help or guidance from others should be given unless notified in advance that this is warranted. Skillathons will be graded after the judging day. Awards will be given for the following categories beginner- age 8-10, intermediate- age 11-13, and senior- age 14 and over. All ages are as of January 1st of the current year. The food and nutrition skillathon awards will be available in the club packets available at booth set-up. The sewing and textiles skillathon awards will be announced and given at the Style Review on Tuesday night of the fair.

Your score sheet from judging will be placed in your clubs packet that is distributed at booth set up. Following judging, your grade will be recorded and premiums will be sent directly to you. Premiums can also be picked up during the Seneca County Fair in the Jr. Fair Office.

Prior to Judging Day

We ask that you please drop off your completed project book, poster, educational display, tri-fold display, collection, sewing project etc. that you have done for your project so that the judge can still go through your book and take a look at everything. We will make sure that the judge receives all of your materials prior to logging in with you for the interview. You may pick up your materials at the Extension Office following your judging day or they will be available on Saturday and Sunday of booth set up.

For Judging Day

Members will receive an e-mail with the details and information on how to join via Zoom at least a couple days prior to their judging day.

We ask that members log-in and have everything ready for judging at least five minutes prior to your scheduled judging time for all projects.

Some things to keep in mind:

- 1) You are still being judged and interviewed the same as those who are coming for face to face judging. Make sure that your dress is nice and appropriate and you practice good hygiene.
- 2) A device that has camera and audio capability is also required. Being on a computer or tablet device will be easier for these capabilities rather than a mobile device. Mobile devices can sometimes be restrictive. Judging is interactive and we want to ensure your full participation by seeing your face and hearing you when questions are asked or prompted to do so.
- 3) I encourage you to test your Zoom account prior to judging to ensure that your camera and audio work and you are able to connect to the Zoom platform okay.
- 4) No one is allowed to join the meeting prior to the host, so if you can't login, keep trying.

- 5) You are required to put in a password. It will be highlighted in the invitation that I send to you via e-mail.
- 6) Full participation from beginning to end is required.
