There will be paper skillathons to complete after the completion of judging for Food and Nutrition and Clothing and Textiles members. Skillathons will be graded after the judging day. Awards will be given for the following categories beginner- age 8-11, intermediate- age 12-13, and senior- age 14 and over. All ages are as of January 1st of the current year. The food and nutrition skillathon awards will be available in the club packets available at booth set-up. The sewing and textiles skillathon awards will be announced and given at the Style Review on Tuesday night of the fair.

The Food and Fashion Board will have individually wrapped homemade cloth facemasks that have 4-H prints available at judging for a donation. If you would like to place an order ahead of time, no problem. Feel free to call the office or e-mail Katie or Erin and let them know how many you wish to receive and we will get them to you. Face masks will be a part of the new normal as we continue with our 4-H program and start having face to face meetings and events again. If you or anyone else need a face

mask, consider helping out the Food and Fashion Board to ensure that we can continue providing great learning experiences like clinics and skillathons for the future.

Members will be able to pick up their premium money from the grade they received on their project(s) directly following judging on the respective day. Members will need to visit the Jr. Fair Board office on the respective judging day in order for you to go and verify your results and receive your premium money. Be sure to have your completed score sheet(s) with you.

For Judging Day

Members cannot attend judging if they or anyone living in their household is experiencing any of the following symptoms: fever, cough, or shortness of breath. Members cannot attend judging if they or anyone in their household has been exposed to COVID-19.

After ensuring that members and anyone within their household does not have any signs, symptoms or exposure to COVID-19:

We ask that members arrive no earlier than five minutes prior to your scheduled judging time for all projects other than clothing and textiles. For clothing and textiles projects, you may arrive no earlier than ten minutes prior to your scheduled judging time to allow time for you to change into your project for judging.

Please bring your own writing utensil to use for judging day. This will be used at the registration table to fill out your score sheet, fill out the skillathon test if you are taking a clothing and textiles or food and nutrition project, and anything else where writing might be warranted.

For Parents or Guardians

There will be no waiting area available in any of the buildings in which judging will be taking place to eliminate congregating. We ask that you please stay outside of the buildings or remain in your vehicles until your child has completed judging. If you decide to wait outside of the building, you must still maintain 6 ft. social distance from any other personnel. Rest assured that there will be plenty of welcoming and friendly adult and youth helping with judging that can assist your child in any way possible.

Guidelines for coming to face-to-face judging and other 4-H related events:

Face Masks

Face masks are expected to be worn at all 4-H in-person meetings and events. Face masks refer to disposable procedure masks or cloth face coverings, not surgical or N-95 respirators. They should fit snugly around the mouth and nose and be worn appropriately to be effective. Remember – it is possible to have COVID-19, not exhibit any symptoms and transmit the virus to others. Wearing a face mask is a measure to protect others.

Face masks are required at the following events: individual interviews, skill-a-thon, and other judging events that may accidentally result in less than 6-foot social distancing space.

Cloth Face Covering Patterns

There are many ways in which you can make a cloth face covering. The CDC offers several different options to make a cloth mask including a sewn mask, a quick-cut t-shirt mask, and a bandana cloth face covering. Practice Good Hygiene

- Wash your hands often, with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after touching any frequently used item or surface.
- Avoid touching your face or others in attendance.
- Sneeze or cough into a tissue or the inside of your elbow.

What we plan to do for face-to-face judging and other 4-H related events:

Sanitizing Stations and Schedules

All entrance/exit door handles for the location and the doors handles of any accessible restrooms and any other high-touch surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected with an EPA-registered cleaner-disinfectant before and after judging.

All tables, chairs, and equipment will be sanitized before the event, after use by each individual, and after the conclusion of the event.

- Provide tissues and make sure there is a wastebasket to dispose of used tissues.
- Provide hand sanitizer that contains at least 70% alcohol at the registration tables or at a table near the entrance of the buildings.
- Provide a plexi-glass shield/barrier for anyone who is unable to wear a mask.

Signage

All in-person 4-H meetings and events are required to have the following signs posted. This is to provide clear communication and transparency regarding the measures 4-H is recommending to promote the safety of the community.
