There will be paper skillathons to complete after the completion of judging for Food and Nutrition and Clothing and Textiles on both the 13th and 16th. Skillathons will be graded after the judging days. Awards will be given for the following categories beginner- age 8-10, intermediate- age 11-13, and senior- age 14 and over. All ages are as of January 1st of the current year. Both the food and nutrition skillathon and sewing and textiles skillathon awards will be announced and given at the Style Review on Tuesday night of the fair.

Members will be able to pick up their premium directly following judging on the day they are judged. Members will need to visit the Jr. Fair Board office on their judging day to receive their premium money based on the grade that is noted on the judging sheet. Be sure to have your completed yellow and pink judging score sheet(s) with you. The Jr. Fair office will keep the yellow copy and exhibitors will keep the pink copy.

New for 2022! Cloverbud Share Fair

On Wednesday, July 13 and Saturday, July 16 in conjunction with pre-fair judging, we are going to allow Cloverbuds to bring in a project that they did with their 4-H Club. They will sit down with an individual and share about the experience and what they learned. The Share Fair will be for participation only and will not have placings or awards. All Cloverbuds will need to register online for a specific time.







For Judging Day

We ask that members arrive no earlier than five minutes prior to your scheduled judging time for all projects other than clothing and textiles. For clothing and textiles projects, you may arrive no earlier than ten minutes prior to your scheduled judging time to allow time for you to change into your project for judging.

What to Wear to Judging:

Please keep in mind that the goal of participating in project interviews is to help 4-H members prepare for future interview situations. Judging is a learning experience of presentation of both yourself and your project; therefore, clothing needs to be appropriate. With that in mind, members should dress as if they were attending a job or college interview.

- General appearance should be neat and clean
- No t-shirts with inappropriate language or graphics
- No gym shorts or cut-off shirts
- Jeans or long pants must not have any holes, tears, rips, or a destructed look
- Skirts/shorts/dresses should be longer than your fingertips at your sides
- · No low cut tops or visible undergarments
- No spaghetti straps, open sides, or midriff showing
- No hats worn during judging. Hats that are part of an ensemble or costume should be removed when speaking with judges
- No flip-flops Examples of appropriate dress: button-down shirts, polos, and blouses with a collar; dressy tops, 4-H club tshirts, nice jeans or slacks, Docker style pants, capris, dresses or skirts that are longer than your fingertips at your sides, dressy sandals, flats, or dress shoes.

Presentation Tips:

- Introduce yourself
- Sit up straight with both feet on the floor
- Look straight into the eyes of the judge
- Do not chew gum or candy
- Speak loud enough to be heard
- · Smile and be polite
- Give the title of your project
- Explain the background of your project
- Tell the judges how you got interested in your project topic
- Explain your areas of interest within your project
- Talk about your results (If you have charts, graphs, or a notebook, show them to the judge and explain them)
- Show the judge a sample of your project work
- Explain what you have learned. If you had some problems or errors with your project, don't be afraid to admit
- Tell the judges what you might do in the future to continue your project
- Explain what you would have done differently if you were to do the project again
- How would your project interest other 4-H members
- Ask the judge if they have any questions for you
- If you do not know the answer to a judge's question, that is okay, simply say, "I am sorry, but I do not know the answer, but I think it is
- Thank the judges at the end

There will be no waiting area available in any of the buildings in which judging will be taking place to eliminate congregating. We ask that you please stay outside of the buildings or remain in your vehicles until your child has completed judging. Rest assured that there will be plenty of welcoming and friendly adults and youth helping with judging that can assist your child in any way possible.
