

Dear 4-H member who is registered for virtual miscellaneous project judging,

We appreciate your interest in wanting to complete your project judging virtually on either Wednesday, July 15, Saturday, July 18, or Saturday, July 25 dependent upon what 4-H project you are taking.

Please be sure to register for an individual time slot for each one of the projects that you are enrolled in. You can do so by clicking on the links below. Please sign up for all appointments no later than **Sunday, July 12**. It is critical that everyone has their own time slot, so please let us know if you made a mistake or can no longer do the time that you registered for. We will make the correction to ensure that we stay as accurate as possible, don't have any duplicates, and have enough time slots for all the members registered in that project area who would like to do face to face or virtual project judging.

There will be paper skillathons to complete after the completion of judging for Food and Nutrition and Clothing and Textiles members. Since you plan to join us virtually, we will have someone share the skillathon on the screen for you to look at and read and you will have to answer the questions verbally or through the chat box. No help or guidance from others should be given unless notified in advance that this is warranted. Skillathons will be graded after the judging day. Awards will be given for the following categories beginner- age 8-11, intermediate- age 12-13, and senior- age 14 and over. All ages are as of January 1st of the current year. The food and nutrition skillathon awards will be available in the club packets available at booth set-up. The sewing and textiles skillathon awards will be announced and given at the Style Review on Tuesday night of the fair.

Your score sheet from judging will be placed in your clubs packet that is distributed at booth set up. Following judging, your grade will be recorded and premiums will be sent directly to you.

Prior to Judging Day

If you wish to drop off your completed project book, poster, educational display, tri-fold display, collection, etc. that you have done for your project so that the judge can still go through your book and take a look at everything; feel free to do so. We will make sure that the judge receives all of your materials prior to logging in with you for the interview. You may pick up your materials at the Extension Office following your judging day or they will be available on Saturday and Sunday of booth set up.

For Judging Day

Members will receive an e-mail with the details and information on how to join via Zoom at least a couple days prior to their judging day.

We ask that members log-in and have everything ready for judging at least five minutes prior to your scheduled judging time for all projects.



Some things to keep in mind:

- 1) You are still being judged and interviewed the same as those who are coming for face to face judging. Make sure that your dress is nice and appropriate and you practice good hygiene.
- 2) A device that has camera and audio capability is also required. Being on a computer or tablet device will be easier for these capabilities rather than a mobile device. Mobile devices can sometimes be restrictive. Judging is interactive and we want to ensure your full participation by seeing your face and hearing you when questions are asked or prompted to do so.
- 3) I encourage you to test your Zoom account prior to judging to ensure that your camera and audio work and you are able to connect to the Zoom platform okay.
- 4) No one is allowed to join the meeting prior to the host, so if you can't login, keep trying.
- 5) You are required to put in a password. It will be highlighted in the invitation that I send to you via e-mail.
- 6) Full participation from beginning to end is required.
