End of Year Packets

Club end of year packets are ready for pick up at the Extension office. These packets contain member/volunteer certificates, pins, secretary and treasurer forms, and other important information. Tenured volunteers also have gifts that can be picked up when the club packet is picked up. We ask that all packets be picked up. If you still have a packet to pick up, please do so ASAP.

<u>Secretary and Treasurer Books, Annual Financial</u> <u>Summary, and Honor Club Forms</u>

Secretary and Treasurer books, annual financial summaries, and honor club forms are due to the Extension Office by January 16, 2024.

Secretary and Treasurer books and Annual Financial Summaries are NOT optional to turn in. These must be turned in, for your club to be in good standing. Honor club forms are optional and can be found in your start up packet from January 2023. If you need a copy, reach out to the office. Old, outdated forms for Annual Financial Summaries WILL NOT be accepted.

2024 Volunteer Fingerprints

If you need to get your fingerprints re-done, you will receive a notification from the Extension office via a letter at mandatory volunteer training in January. You will have until **February 15**, **2024** to complete your fingerprints. If this is not completed by the deadline, you will not be considered a volunteer for 2024. Be sure to keep the receipt and reimbursement forms and turn them into the Extension office following the completion of your fingerprints.

Club Officer Training

There will be an officer training for anyone who is an elected officer. This will include President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, News Reporter, Recreation Leader, Health and Safety Officer, etc. The training will be held on Monday, March 11, 2024 from 7-8:30 p.m. Look for more detailed information coming soon and in our next newsletter!

4-H Club Meeting Visits

We will be cycling back through our clubs for club visits. A representative of the 4-H Advisory Council will come to sit in at your meeting. 4-H Club visits are being conducted to help support and advise on club structure and observe how club meetings are ran. This is a way for us to help you improve meeting structure if need be and provide feedback. Once you have set your schedule of meeting times and dates for your club for the 2024 4-H year, please be sure to provide a copy to the Extension office.

4-H Club Audits

Five clubs were randomly selected to be audited by the Seneca County 4-H Advisory Council. All clubs that were selected should have already received notification and more information in the mail and in end of the year club packets. The audits will take place following January 16, when secretary and treasurer books are turned into the office. This is a way to ensure all clubs are following the correct financial guidelines as suggested by the Extension office. It will also protect the treasurer, club, advisors, and Extension office in the case of any financial issues or challenges by others. Audits that do not pass inspection will require further investigation.

Newsletters

Our 4-H newsletters go out to all of our 4-H members and their families and advisors quarterly. These times are Jan-March, April-June, July-September, and October-December. Our newsletters are digital/electronic only. We will have a few hard copies available in the Extension office if you need to access one that way.



New Volunteer Information

Anyone who would like to apply to be a 4-H volunteer for the 2024 4-H year must submit a volunteer application online by January 31st, 2024 to be considered for the 2024 4-H season. Any active volunteers must attend a training to be a volunteer in 2024. Seneca County volunteers MUST attend one of our scheduled trainings. Attending another counties volunteer training is NOT an option and will not be considered for fulfilling the annual training requirement. New volunteers in 2024 do not have to attend this, as it is all covered in your new volunteer orientation.

2024 Important Camp Information and Camp Counselor Information

2024 camp dates will be announced soon. Stay tuned! As a reminder, there will be no full camp scholarships given out. We highly encourage you to start thinking of ways you can save up for camp now. It could be a fundraiser with your club or saving a little each month. Scholarships at most will be half of the cost of camp per applicant if accepted.

Teens age 14-18 years old as of January 1st, 2024 can apply to be a camp counselor. Camp counselor applications will be due to the Extension office by December 4, 2023. Interviews for counselors will take place on Thursday, December 21 and Friday, December 22, 2023 from 9 a.m.- 5:00 p.m. at the Extension office. First year counselors will be considered counselors in training (CIT's) and will be required to help with Cloverbud Camp. Seneca County 4-H Endowment

Endowments are a means of providing long-term support for the 4-H program in Seneca County. Contributions to the Endowment are invested, producing annual distributions from the interest earnings in perpetuity - which essentially means forever. Endowment funds are managed by the Office of the Treasurer of Ohio State University, which in turn gives us approximately a 4.5% interest rate. For County 4-H Endowments, each county has full control over the interest income generated by their endowment. Important Quality Assurance Information

Quality Assurance Training for Adults/Volunteers

There is an opportunity for you to get certified to be an Assistant Quality Assurance Instructor. The certification to be an Assistant Instructor for Quality Assurance is good for three years.

The following trainings will be held at the Extension Office to receive certification or re-certification to be an Assistant Quality Assurance Instructor. Please let the Extension office know by Friday, December 1st which training you plan to attend.

- Thursday, December 7th at 5:30 p.m.
- Thursday, December 14th at 9:00 a.m.
- Monday, December 18th at 4:30 p.m.

The cost of these trainings will be \$10/person. Checks should be made payable to OSU Extension.

Quality Assurance for Livestock Exhibitors

Every member taking livestock (not horses or dogs) must attend Quality Assurance training. First year members taking a livestock project **must** attend a county wide Quality Assurance session put on by the Seneca County OSU Extension office and Jr. Fair and a parent/guardian **must** be present the entire time. There are four options for completing Quality Assurance Training:

 Attend one of the county wide trainings offered in Seneca County.

County Wide Quality Assurance will be offered on the following dates with some locations to be determined. ALL FIRST-YEAR livestock exhibitors must attend one of these sessions, with a parent or guardian present with them the entire time. There are <u>NO</u> exceptions to this.

There will be a test out option for those members who are 15-18 years old. This is only offered at County Wide QA sessions. Once a member tests out of QA they no longer have attend a QA session or test out the following year. You are done for the remainder of your 4-H career. These ages are as of January 1, 2024- a youth's 4-H age.

- Tuesday, Feb. 27, 2024 6:00 pm, test out starting at 5:00 pm, location TBD
- Monday, March 25, 2024 6:00 pm, test out starting at 5:00 pm at Mohawk Schools
- Sunday, April 28, 2024 1:00 pm, test out starting at 12:00 pm, location TBD

Quality Assurance for Livestock Exhibitors Continued:

 Attend a qualified Quality Assurance training with/in your club

Certified Assistant Instructors will be able to teach Quality Assurance at the club level. If they choose to open it up to others to attend, we will compile a list and you will be notified. **These do not qualify for first year members.**

- Attend a qualified Quality Assurance training in another Ohio county- fees may apply. You can call the Extension office for dates and times.
 These do not qualify for first year members.
- Attend a qualified Quality Assurance training at an Ohio 4-H approved event.

These could be at a clinic, Junior Swine Day, Ohio Beef Expo, Dairy Palooza, Buckeye Young Shepherds' Expo, Ohio 4-H Conference, etc. **These do not qualify for first year members.**

Quality Assurance must be completed May 1, 2024 for all livestock exhibitors. This is strictly enforced. There are ZERO exceptions. Members who do not complete QA by the county deadline will not be eligible to show livestock at the Seneca County Fair.

Seneca County CARTEENS

If you are interested in being a teen instructor for CARTEENS, you do not need to be in 4-H, but you must be at least 14 years old. As soon as you turn 14, you can join CARTEENS; it does not have to be by January 1st. We meet the third Monday of February, April, June, August, October, and December at 6:30 p.m. at the Extension Office. We would love to have you join our team. Teen facilitators teach other teen traffic offenders about speeding, operating a vehicle impaired, and distracted driving. Being a CARTEEN is a great way to improve public speaking skills and learn more about teaching tools and not to mention there are gas cards, scholarships, and fun trips that you can earn. Save the dates for our next few programs: October 16th and December 18th.


News from Junior Leadership Club Continued:

HealthU

Are you a 4-H'er interested in health? Do you see yourself potentially working in health one day? Nutritionist? Therapist? Nurse? Athletic Trainer? Geneticist?

What: Health University (HealthU) is a weekend camp in October focused on Healthy Living for 7th through 12th graders in Ohio 4-H. Join us at Canter's Cave 4-H Camp for a weekend as we explore four of the 10 Dimensions of Wellness and explore health-related careers. We will be exploring the following four tracks of wellness:

- Physical wellness allows a person to engage in activities of daily living without experiencing undue fatigue or exhaustion. The physical dimension of wellness is supported through health behaviors, which include exercise, eating a healthy diet, limiting alcohol intake, not smoking, and getting adequate sleep each night.
- Emotional wellness involves recognizing, accepting, and expressing feelings. Adequate rest is required for wellness in this dimension. If an individual's mental function is hindered by stress and lack of sleep, they may struggle with accurately assessing a situation which then triggers negative emotional responses and disrupts emotional wellness.
- Social wellness requires the ability to trust and respect other people and leads to the creation of supportive partnerships and friendships.
 Being socially well allows one to develop and maintain intimacy, and to have empathy and respect for others.
- Creative wellness allows a person to appreciate and/or participate in a diverse range of arts or cultural experiences, and to value and cherish the surrounding world. Freely expressing thoughts and emotions through dance, song, drawing, painting, or writing are some of the ways to engage in creative wellness.

Ohio 4-H Global Immersion Project

When: March 31st – April 10th, 2024.

Ohio 4-H Teens 15-18 (Teens must be nominated by Ohio 4-H Professionals)

Where: American Farm School

(https://www.afs.edu.gr/) - Thessaloniki, Greece

What: Cross-Cultural and Agricultural Career field exploration program designed to help youth learn about Ag careers, cross-cultural interactions, workforce preparation and leadership skills. Teens will be part of a "Work Internship" with AFS Greek high school students and work in cohorts to focus on different Agricultural program units that include: Animal and Plant Production, Food Science & Technology, and more.

To be determined – final cost based on Cost: Grants received (Estimate-\$2,400 - includes airfare. most meals, lodging, ground transportation, park entrance and program fees.)

Ohio 4-H Global Immersion Project Continued:

Participant Selection: Ohio 4-H Professionals have the opportunity to nominate youth. Final selection will be based on geographic and demographic characteristics and the below criteria:

- Have an interest in agriculture or are unsure what career path they'd like to pursue.
- Can embrace unique and different cultures beyond their local communities.
- Willing to share their experiences through presentations, blogs, photos, etc. at the local and state level.
- A good representation of the local 4-H program.
- Teen who has not expressed interest in pursuing statewide 4-H opportunities before.

Additional Trip Components Include:

Student Workshops: Tasting and Sensory analysis of

Olive Oil, Cheese, and other local

foods. Mediterranean diet: science and culture.

Recreation: Sports, teambuilding and Leadership activities with AFS students, hiking Mount Olympus (highest peak in Greece - 9,573 ft.), trekking in Enipea Canyon, waterfalls, and more
